DC AHEC Scholar Program

The DC AHEC Scholar Program was developed by faculty from the AHEC partner schools to prepare students for clinical practice in primary care settings with a special emphasis on underserved populations. Scholars will make a first-hand impact on underserved communities in D.C. and the benefits include:

- A competitive advantage for external scholarship opportunities, residency programs and/or loan repayment programs

Clinical Placements

Clinical training for medical, nurse practitioner, and physician assistant students is available through CC AHEC partner clinics. CC AHEC partners with Safety Net Clinics to provide health care in underserved communities.

Continuing Education

CC AHEC offers professional support for health care providers practicing in underserved areas in the District of Columbia. Our goal is to support our clinical preceptors by funding opportunities that enhance clinical skills and help maintain professional certifications.
